League Features

League play begins on Wednesday, May 3rd with play continuing weekly through until Wednesday, September 13th. The league will conclude on Wednesday, September 20th with the annual Year-End Social Fundraiser. This is a shotgun-style tournament in the evening, that requires early registration and an additional fee. With lots of fundraising for local women's charities, you are bound to leave with a prize and a smile on your face! More details regarding this event will be provided to you in August.

Your 2023 Club Card provides you with the following benefits:

- a 30% discount on posted green fee rates during designated league tee times, and a 25% discount on golf outside of league tee times!

- You must be a 2023 Club Card holder to participate in the Women's League
- 10% discount on Golf Shop merchandise

Green Fees

Green fees are not included in the league fee. As a Women's League player, your Club Card will provide you with a 30% discount on green fees during designated league tee times. It will also provide you with a 25% discount on power cart rentals during league play, and a 25% discount on green fees and power cart rentals outside of league tee times.

All golfers must check in at the golf shop each week. You may opt to save a credit card to your account for quick and easy check-in procedures.

The Club Card Program

- An optional pre-paid balance that can be loaded with a dollar value of your choice to be used towards any purchases at the Golf Club

The Club Card has an annual expiry date on December 31, 2023. Each year, you will be required to renew/purchase your Club Card to participate in league activities. Although a physical card is not required, we will be updating photos of our guests so we can quickly and easily identify you at check-in.

Fund Raising for Breast Cancer Research, Treatment, and Rehabilitation

Merry–Hill Golf Club has been dedicated to raising charitable funds in support of Breast Cancer Research and Patient Wellness. How To BookYour Tee Time

Morning league tee times are available from 8:00 am to 11:00 am, including both 9 or 18-hole time slots. Afternoon league tee times are available from 4:00 pm to 6:30 pm with 9-hole time slots only. League tee times are reserved for Women's League players and their guests. You may book tee times for yourself or your group as follows:

In-Person -14 days in advance:

• The League Coordinator will book your tee time(s) at the registration table under the marquee.

Online - 10 days in advance at 12:00 am on SATURDAYS**

- Women's League players may book online. You must book into designated league tee times only (ask to see the online booking procedure in the Golf Shop)
- 9-hole and 18-hole tee times are available for league bookings in the morning.
- Only 9-hole tee times are available in the afternoon
- When booking your tee times online, please enter the names of the other golfers in your group
- You are using the same reservation system as the general public, therefore you cannot see golfer's names online call the Golf Shop if you would like to know who is playing at specific times, or if you forget your tee time
- If you need to cancel or change your tee time please call the golf shop or sign in to your online booking account to make changes. We ask for a minimum of 24 hours notice of any change or cancelation

No-Show and Cancellation Policy

Cancellations: We have a 48-hour cancelation policy for league players, please follow it. Call 519-648-2831 and speak with either the league coordinator or the Golf Shop staff.

- No-shows will be charged \$25.00 +HST.
- If you cannot attend your tee time, a "replacement" player can be sent in your place such that the position has been filled by a golfer with or without a Club Card. This negates any no-show fee from being charged.

PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE PHONE MESSAGES OR SEND EMAILS TO CANCEL TEE TIMES

There will be times when you will see non-league players on the golf course during your round. We do our best to group all league members together and send you out in consecutive tee times. Tee times that have not been booked by Women's League players will become available to regular customers. Thank you for understanding.

Weather-Related Cancellations

Please contact the Golf Shop when inclement weather may interfere with your golfing activity. If you are unable to finish your round of golf, Merry–Hill will provide you with a rain check based on our generous rain check policy.

Check-In Procedures

Please arrive a minimum of 15 minutes before your tee time. This will allow you ample time to check in at the Golf Shop and with your League Coordinator, purchase your 50/50 tickets, use the washroom facilities, and purchase a cold beverage before heading to the putting green to warm up!

We accept credit, debit, and cash for payments. We also encourage you to use your PrePaid account for even faster check-in.

Women's League Guest Privileges

Each Women's League member is permitted to bring a guest to join them once (1) throughout the season. Your Club Card discount is not transferable to your guest. They will be required to pay for the posted green fee rate and will receive the Club Card discount if they are a Club Card holder themselves. Please be aware that the League is full and times are scarce. We reserve the option to decline a guest to accommodate a current league member.

Handicap Tracking

Included in your league registration is handicap tracking. If you'd like to participate in this, you will need to fill in your scorecard and hand it into the Golf Shop or League Coordinator at the end of your round. You will be able to review your updated handicap roughly 48 hours later either on the Golf Canada App or Website, or on the Women's League website.

Year End Social Tournament-September 20th, 2023 - Planned shotgun event

This event is a league social fundraiser including 9 holes of golf and dinner along with a raffle to raise money for local women's charities. Sign up early as the number of participants is limited. Every year we have a ton of great prizes to win and lots of fun on the course! More information will be provided closer to the event date. Registration is not included with your league fees and will take place in August.

Etiquette at Merry-Hill Golf Club

Safety

- Players should ensure that no one is standing in a position that would cause them to be hit with the club or the ball when the player makes a stroke or practice swing.
- Players should not play until the players in front are out of range.
- If a player should accidentally hit a ball where it may strike other golfers, a warning should be shouted immediately. This warning is typically "FORE!," not "I'll get you next time!"

Consideration for Other Players

- Players should always show consideration toward other players on the course. They should not disturb
 others by moving, talking, or making unnecessary noise. Players should also ensure that electronic
 devices brought onto the golf course do not disturb the other players.
- A player should not tee up their ball until it is their turn to play.
- Players should not stand directly behind the ball or directly in front of the hole when a player is about to take a shot.
- On the putting green, players should not stand on another player's line of putt or cast a shadow over another player's line of putt when they are taking a stroke. Players should also remain close to the putting green until all of the players have sunk their ball.
- The player who is keeping the score should ask the players their score while walking to the next tee. Pace of Play
 - Players should give themselves enough time to park their car, unload their clubs, check in with Golf Shop, and be ready to play at their scheduled tee time. A player's tee time is when they are scheduled to start play, not when they are to arrive at the golf course.
 - Players should try to keep a good pace of play while on the golf course. It is your group's responsibility to keep up with the group ahead. Keep in mind that a maximum of 5 shots to get to the green and 4 on the green should be taken no more. Always be ready when it is your turn to shoot.
 - Keep bags and carts in a position that will allow you to leave the green and move to the next tee quickly.
 - If a player should lose a ball, they should drop another where it is suspected the ball was lost, or where it either left the course or entered a pond.

Taking Care of the Course

- Players should also repair any divot holes, ball marks on the greens, or any damage their shoes may have caused (no hard spikes allowed on the course).
- Players should avoid leaning on their putters while on the green.
- The head of a golf club should not be used to remove a ball from the hole.
